At a glance, here is the College of Nursing at the end of 2024.

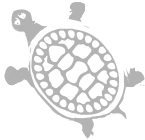

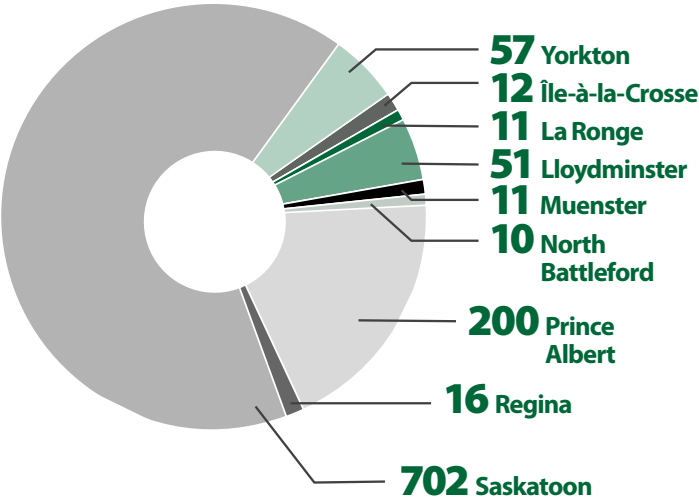

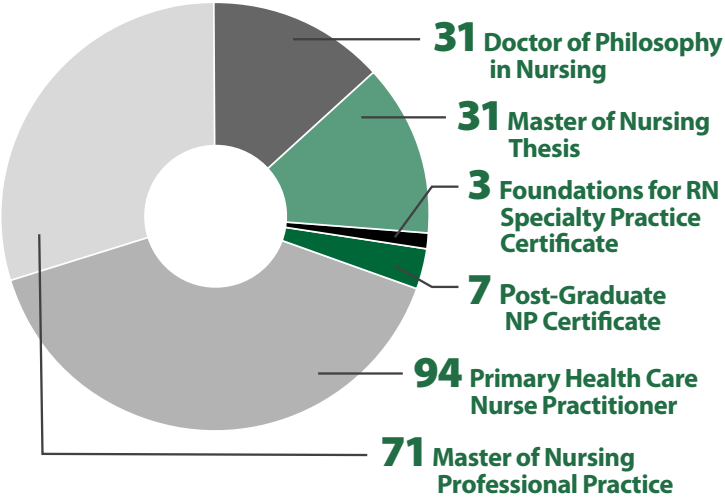
