Ranks and salary will be based on academic and professional qualifications, experience and accomplishments of the successful candidates. The salary bands (2025-2026 academic year) are Assistant Professor \$110,489 to \$131,900 and Associate Professor \$131,909 to \$153, 329, Professor \$153,329 to \$178,319. These positions include an attractive comprehensive benefits package which includes a dental, health and extended vision care plan; pension plan, life insurance (compulsory and voluntary), academic long-term disability, sick leave, travel insurance, death benefits, an employee assistance program, a professional expense allowance, and a flexible health and wellness spending program.
