The University of Saskatchewan Community of Aboriginal Nursing (UCAN) is the University of Saskatchewan College of Nursing's Aboriginal student achievement program. The goal of this program is to increase the number of Aboriginal people in the nursing

profession, contributing to healthier communities. The program has been operational since 1984 (previously called the Native Access Program to Nursing (NAPN)) and has played an instrumental role in the College's success in recruiting and retaining Aboriginal nursing students. Since its inception, the program has helped the College graduate more Aboriginal nurses than

any other program in Canada.

Learn Where YOU Live

Students are able to complete the entire Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree program across Saskatchewan at sites in Ile-a-Ia-Crosse, La Ronge, Prince Albert, Regina, Saskatoon and Yorkton. There are even more locations across the province available for students to take the 1st (pre-professional) year, including on-reserve at Onion Lake Cree Nation. Learning close to home can promote success for Aboriginal students by allowing them to maintain family obligations, access community supports and avoid relocation costs.

UCAN nursing advisors work with Aboriginal students in Saskatoon, Prince Albert and Regina and all students in Ile-a-la-Crosse and La Ronge to build community and provide advisement and support. The College has set aside 16.6% of seats for Aboriginal applicants who meet the minimum entrance requirements, including seats in our graduate level Nurse Practitioner program.
