## 2 YEAR OPTION OVERVIEW

- The Post-Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing (PDBSN) is an undergraduate degree option that recognizes previous university achievements and gives you the opportunity to earn a BSN degree in a shortened period of time. You may take this option if you have completed a baccalaureate degree in another field or have made significant progress towards a degree.
- As a post-degree nursing student, your classes will be fast-paced, challenging you both personally and professionally, pushing your boundaries of knowledge in health. You will also participate in nursing practice, patient and family-centered care, and clinical learning experiences.

This option must be completed as **full-time intensive study** at the **USask Saskatoon Campus**. Begin your program in January and in **less than two calendar years**, you will earn your BSN degree.



## HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- You can apply to the Post-Degree BSN option if you have completed a baccalaureate degree or have completed at least 90 credit units towards one.
- Prerequisites for the Post-Degree BSN option include: Statistics, Anatomy and Physiology, Microbiology, Nutrition, Humanities, Indigenous Studies, and Social Sciences.  
Please Note: Some of these classes must have been completed within the last 10 years.
- Apply for admission to the University of Saskatchewan College of Nursing. Admission is competitive and based on academic achievement and the CASPer® situational judgment exam.
