



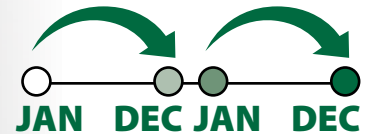

## 2 YEAR OPTION OVERVIEW

- The Post-Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) is an undergraduate degree option that recognizes previous university achievements and gives you the opportunity to earn a BSN in a shortened period of time. You may take this option if you have completed a baccalaureate degree in another field or have made significant progress towards a degree.
- As a post-degree nursing student, your classes will be fast-paced, challenging you both personally and professionally. The content you study will challenge you to push the boundaries of knowledge in health. You will also participate in nursing practice, patient and family-centered care, and clinical learning experiences.

This option must be completed as **full-time intensive study** at the **USask Saskatoon Campus**. Begin your program in January and in **less than two calendar years**, you will earn your BSN degree.

## HOW DO I GET STARTED?

- You can apply to the Post-Degree BSN option if you have completed a baccalaureate degree or have completed at least 90 credit units towards one.
- Prerequisites for the Post-Degree BSN option include: Statistics, Anatomy and Physiology, Microbiology, Nutrition, Humanities, Indigenous Studies, and Social Sciences.
- Apply for admission to the University of Saskatchewan College of Nursing. Admission is competitive and based on academic achievement and the CASPer® situational judgment exam.
