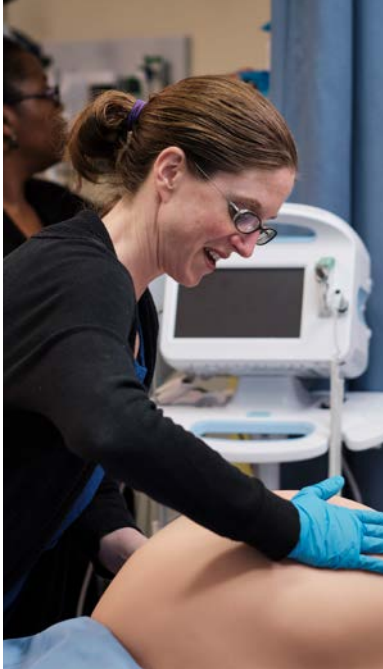
The College of Nursing offers a variety of graduate programs for registered nurses to advance their nursing career. Students can study at one of our three campuses or take their program online.
