The College of Nursing offers a non-direct entry four year Bachelor of Science in Nursing program consisting of a pre-professional year, followed by three years of nursing education. We also offer a Post-Degree Bachelor in Science in Nursing option for those students who have already completed a baccalaureate degree, or have made significant progress toward a degree in another field.

The University of Saskatchewan is one of Canada's top 15 research intensive universities. The College of Nursing plays an active role in the university's strong research culture. Working together, we are tackling some of the most pressing health-care issues and leading innovations in health-care education. Our faculty have been awarded provincial, national, and

international funding and have forged strong alliances with community partners and researchers around the globe. They are recognized as leaders in their fields of research and professional practice and for their contributions to advance the health of Canadians.

One of six Canadian Indigenous Research Chairs in Nursing was awarded to College of Nursing associate professor Dr. Holly Graham (PhD) in April 2020. Entitled wahkohtowin, this chair is focused on mentorship and reconciliation, with the goal of improving the health of Indigenous peoples.
