What is The Conversation?

The Conversation Canada launched in June 2017. The Conversation is an independent source of news and views, from the academic and research community, delivered direct to the public.

The Conversation has a goal of making academic research accessible to a mainstream audience, and they communicate this mission clearly in their slogan: "academic rigor, journalistic flair". The Conversation utilizes a team of professional editors who work with experts to unlock their knowledge and parcel it in a digestible

format and publish it on a platform that is both easy to access and to share. This openaccess model is free to read and free to publish; an intentional design to help promote the sharing of facts and free-flow of information.

How is helpful for researchers?

For better or worse, social media and its role in the spread of information, is here to stay. Many scientists are adapting to this landscape and are actively engaging on social media, discussing everything from methods to the latest developments in research. Some even use social media to raise funds, provide mentoring online and provide a space to build both social and professional networks, allowing scientists to develop new collaborations.

Perhaps one of the most important uses of The Conversation is to provide a method to share scientifically tested information with a lay audience and allow space for respectful public discourse; a powerful antidote to the wide-spread sharing of false information. (continued on Page 2)

While not peer reviewed in the traditional sense of an academic journal, The Conversation editors will review the article and work with the author to provide feedback on: the article itself, whether it is a good fit for The Conversation, and if the timeliness is appropriate. September 30th is the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

This day, which was established as one of the 94 recommendations from the <u>Truth and Reconciliation</u> <u>Commission</u>, provides an opportunity for Canadians to recognize and commemorate the legacy of residential schools. This may present itself as a day of quiet reflection or participation in a community event. This date coincides with <u>Orange Shirt Day</u>, which began in 2013 and involves wearing orange shirts to honour Indigenous children forced to leave their families to attend residential schools.

- The National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation provides a number of <u>Education resources</u> that can help raise awareness of the history and creation of the residential school system, its ongoing legacy, and how it has shaped the country we live in today.
