Message from Dr. Pammla Petrucka, Interim Associate Dean, Research & Graduate Studies

Research Administration 101: Working on your Curriculum Vitae (CV)? NURSE can help!

Creating a curriculum vitae (CV) can often be a daunting task, however, creating a strong CV from the beginning of the process onward can be beneficial in many ways. By providing the information listed below, it showcases one's accomplishments and a CV is often requested when applying for awards and/or scholarships. Within academia, there are two types of CVs that faculty need for very different purposes. These types,



including purpose, and details regarding <u>NURSE</u> support are described below.

UnivRS electronic CV (eCV): For USask faculty, it is a requirement of all faculty to have an up-to-date CV through UnivRS. The eCV is required for collegial processes such as tenure and promotion, salary review, and annual review. This year, NURSE will be assisting all faculty in a one-time project where NURSE will assist in creating/updating faculty eCVs in the UnivRS system. Faculty will be contacted by NURSE in alphabetical order according to rank as listed on the college website. To best assist with this process, a recent CV in Word format will be requested so a comparison can be made between the CV and what is appearing on the eCV.

Canadian Common CV (CCV): The CCV is one of the largest databases grant agencies utilize for creating CVs for grant applications. Various kinds of CCVs can be created for grant agencies such as CIHR, SHRF, Heart & Stroke Foundation, and SSHRC. Registration with the Canadian Common CV can be done <u>HERE</u>. Along with the eCV project noted above, NURSE will be assisting in creating CCVs for all College of Nursing faculty. This process will begin once a faculty member's eCV has been completed and validated.

Tips for updating your eCV and CCV:

- For all entries, ensure you have both the start date (month and year) and end date (month and year) for each entry.
- When entering authors or research group participants, begin with the individual's last name followed by their initial (for example: Person, A).
- If you are unsure of the format required for entries, click on the question mark (?) located by the section title.
- The Canadian Common CV (CCV) is different from ResearchNet; ensure you register with both, if applicable, for grant applications.
- Review the agency's call or research funding opportunity information to determine which CCV format is required for the grant you are applying. Note: Some agencies, such as CIHR, have more than one format.
- If you require assistance with creating a CCV for a grant application, please contact <u>Raeleen</u> at least 15 days before the grant application deadline.
