

Post-Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing

The Post-Degree Bachelor of Science in Nursing (PDBSN) is an undergraduate degree option at the College of Nursing, which recognizes previous university achievements and provides the opportunity for students to earn a BSN in a condensed period of time. It is available to students who have completed a baccalaureate degree in another field or who have made significant progress toward a degree.

This option provides the opportunity for full-time intensive study with program completion in less than two calendar years at our Saskatoon campus.

READY TO APPLY?

You can apply to the Post-Degree BSN program if you have completed a baccalaureate degree or have made significant progress (at least 90 credit units) toward a degree, including these prerequisites*:

- Indigenous Studies (three credit units)
- Statistics (three credit units)
- Humanities (three credit units)
- Social Sciences (six credit units)

Must have been completed within the last 10 years:

- Anatomy and Physiology (six credit units)
- Microbiology (three credit units)
- Nutrition (three credit units)

*One subject deficiency in Nutrition, Indigenous Studies, or Social Science is permitted if the deficient course is completed by the end of December of the year you are admitted.

Admission to the Post-Degree BSN option is competitive. A minimum average of 70% (calculated on the last 60 credit units towards a degree) is required. A competitive average will be calculated based on post-secondary coursework completed before December 31 of the year prior to the desired entrance date.
