Writing Centre: Tutoring

What can tutors help you with?

Tutors can help you to

- clarify your goals
- improve your organization and writing style
- learn how to outline, draft, and revise your work
- understand and practice academic writing conventions
- understand the rules of grammar, sentence structure, and punctuation
- navigate citation styles and various writing genres across the disciplines

Tutors are teachers, not copyeditors, and so they cannot edit or proofread your work (i.e., correct grammar and punctuation). Instead, they can teach you how to find and correct errors so that you improve over time. You can access tutoring for free as often as you like.

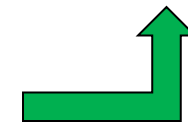

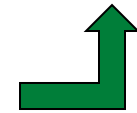
