Textbooks

You can order your textbooks and medical supplies from the **Shop USask Bookstore website**. *Under Course Materials*, select *My Textbooks* to access your textbook list. You will need to enter your NSID (example: abc123) and password.

Used books may also be purchased from former or upper-year students. Textbooks can also be ordered through amazon.ca. However, *please check that the ISBN number* is the same as posted by the professor for the class.

Library Services

As a University of Saskatchewan student, you have remote access to various electronic resources through the University of Saskatchewan Library. These can be accessed through the Library Resources channel in your PAWS account or on the library website.

<u>Distance and Distributed Library Services (DDLS)</u> are available at no charge to all University of Saskatchewan students, faculty, and staff living outside Saskatoon. The library will supply materials from our collections in response to requests submitted electronically. Books will be mailed with a postage paid return label. Copies of journal articles do not have to be returned.



Student Wellness-Health Plan

Full-time, on-campus students automatically pay for a health and dental plan provided through their student association (the USSU for undergraduate students and the GSA for graduate students). You must have a Saskatchewan health card, (or health coverage equal to or greater than that provided by a Saskatchewan health card) to make a claim on this extended health coverage. Students who are located at the **Lloydminster site** will not be paying into the plan. This Health Insurance fee is charged to your fall student fees only. If you are off campus in term 1, you will not be assessed the fee. **If you wish to have coverage, you must opt in**.
