Textbooks

You can order textbooks and medical supplies from the Shop USask Bookstore <u>website</u>. Under *Course Materials*, select *My Textbooks*. To access your textbook list, you will need to enter your NSID (e.g. abc123) and password. The USask Bookstore offers free shipping to your home address sometime in August. Secondhand books may also be purchased from former or upper-year students. Textbooks can also be ordered through amazon.ca. However, <u>please check that the ISBN number</u> is the same as that posted by the professor for the class.
