CLASS REGISTRATION - *IMPORTANT TIPS*

You will need to register for the following classes:

- Fall Semester: MCIM 223, NURS 200, NURS 202 (plus lab) NURS 204 (plus seminar), NURS 206 (plus required link), NURS 207, plus any deficient class must be completed by December or you will be required to discontinue studies.
- Winter Semester: PHAR 250, NURS 203 (plus lab), N205, NURS 208, NURS 220 (plus lab)

Registration tips: Prior to attempting to register, clear your browser history, restart your device, and register for **ALL CLASSES** at once; <u>do not hit submit between classes</u>.



TEXTBOOKS

You can order your textbooks and medical supplies from the Shop USASK Bookstore website at <u>https://bookstore.usask.ca/students.php</u>. Under *Course Materials*, select *My Textbooks* to access your textbook list. You will need to enter your NSID (example: abc123) and password.

Secondhand books may also be purchased from former or upper-year students. Textbooks can also be ordered through amazon.ca. However, *please check that the ISBN number* is the same as posted by the professor for the class.

LIBRARY SERVICES

As a University of Saskatchewan student, you have remote access to a number of electronic resources through the University of Saskatchewan Library. These can be accessed through the Library Resources channel in your PAWS account or at <u>https://library.usask.ca</u>.

Distance and Distributed Library Services (DDLS) are available at no charge to all University of Saskatchewan students, faculty, and staff living outside Saskatoon. The library will supply materials from our collections in response to requests submitted electronically. Books will be mailed with a postage paid return label. STUDENT WELLNESS-HEALTH PLAN

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR NURSING STUDENTS LLOYDMINSTER SITE BSN

GENERAL INFORMATION

- The University of Saskatchewan requires that all students attending a Health Science College provide documented proof of immunization.
- Please review <u>https://nursing.usask.ca/clinical/immunization.php</u> for the most up to date information.
- All nursing students are required to complete the recommended immunizations for health care workers as outlined in the <u>Saskatchewan Immunization Manual</u>, (available online at: <u>www.ehealthsask.ca/services/manuals/Pages/SIM.aspx</u>) prior to any contact between students and patients/clients.
- Students are required to submit to the College of Nursing proof of immunizations prior to participation in clinical experience.
- Failure to maintain recommended immunizations may delay a student's progress in their studies.
- Specific immunizations will be required for certain clinical placements and in specific circumstances such as disease outbreaks. Students who refuse or are unable to comply with this requirement may be at risk of not being able to complete required components of their program.
- Any applicable costs of immunization are the responsibility of the student.
- <u>CONSENT FORM BELOW</u>: Immunization records and/or serology results will be shared from the Nurse reviewing your records with your College and clinical placements throughout your studies as required – this is to ensure your safety and the safety of your clients. You are required to sign a consent form to authorize sharing of this information.

IMMUNIZATION INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Review Specific Immunization Requirements below.
- 2. Locate your childhood and adult immunization records. If you do not have these records, contact your Public Health Unit or Family Doctor.
- 3. Send a **copy** of your **Consent Form (pg. 5) AND Immunization Records by August 15** (earlier is better if you can) to:

4. You may choose to see your Family Physician to begin and/or complete your immunization review.

Your College requires you to have your immunization reviewed by <u>October 14, 2024</u>. We recognize this may be "in progress" as of this date. Updated immunization is required, or it may prevent you from attending your clinical placement.



SPECIFIC IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Tetanus/Diphtheria (Td):

Primary series of 3-5 doses, then a booster every 10 years.

Pertussis:

Primary series and Tdap or Tdap – Pertussis booster.

Polio:

Primary series, booster if travelling in endemic areas.

Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR):

Proof of vaccination (2 doses) OR proof of immunity by serological evidence.

Tuberculin skin test (TST):

• Two step TST required prior to client contact.

Hepatitis B:

- Two or three doses followed by an antibody check.
- If you have already received the series, lab evidence of immunity is required.
 - If the Hepatitis B Surface Antibody is non-immune, the public nurse will provide further direction.
 - **Note**: if you do not currently have your Hepatitis B immunizations you should begin this series **as soon as possible**, as it takes several months to complete.

Varicella (Chickenpox)

Serological evidence of immunity OR proof of one or two doses of varicella vaccination.

Influenza

• Strongly recommended.

COVID-19

Strongly recommended.
